We bought a washing machine to cope with increase of soiled clothing, a car seat to take her to and from hospital and we gave them small respite breaks between treatments. We were also there to be friends and to listen to their concerns.

Miracles has been there for thousands of children like Summer since our launch in 1994 offering practical support and friendship to those living in poverty and facing a life crisis.

However, the recession has seen our UK funding base shrink and we are now facing our own crisis. We desperately need your support to continue to help children like Summer.

FROM THE PEN OF MADAME CHAIR

Dear Friends,

This year has been one of the hardest *Miracles* has ever had to face with our Trustees and Staff being asked to dig deeper into their own pockets to help secure the charity's future. Miraculously we have been able to meet the most urgent cases of Supreme Need being referred to us by desperate aid agencies in response to the mass of calls for help they, too, are facing from a country struggling to keep its head above the waters of recession.

Thanks to La Fondacion *Miracles* Suisse and the tireless work of Ingrid Tissot who has kindly contributed to this Review, The *Miracles*' Centre in Mostar is secure with approximately one limb per week being made and fitted. Much more money is, however, needed to provide more and more limbs as the demand increases. We are deeply indebted to The John Armitage Foundation and to The International Trust Fund for their continued support but even the latter is feeling the pain of recession at the moment. It is fervently hoped, of course, that this will not jeopardise their continued funding which to date has enabled us to treat further patients whose gratitude is coupled with ours for giving them the opportunity of a less painful and more fruitful life.

Again thanks to the generous support of various of our Friends of *Miracles*' Support Group, our Roma families are well cared for – and growing rapidly with three more babies born during the year. The school achievements are a huge credit to the families and cause for great pride both to them and to us. The *Miracles*' Roma project in Zenica is truly a success story and let us just pray that the generosity of people like the Bollinger family and Trustee Joseph Caruso and his wife, Caroline, will continue well into the future so that the ten-year project will run its course.

Sadly, here at home the situation is not so positive since with our reserves running low we have had to severely curtail the number of referrals continually being received from CABs, Hospitals and Social Services. It is heartbreaking having to refuse so many critical cases and every effort is being made to attract more UK funding so that we can 'be there' for those who have learned to rely on us so heavily. Happily, though, at our Goodwood Ball in March we launched an appeal to fund a series of Respite Breaks for Supreme Need families coping with sickness and disability. Thanks to some extremely generous guests at the Ball we were able to send six of these families to Canute Cottages in Chichester Harbour in their school holidays and these breaks have meant a very great deal to those who benefitted as you will see from the report in the following pages.

With the desperate one-in-three child poverty rate in this country mentioned in our Review of last year, we are now launching a new project called One-in-Three to assist such children and to include Child Carers of which there are estimated to be some 700,000 within the UK. Working with The Princess Royal Fund For Carers we are developing this project as a potential beneficiary of The National Lottery and other large grant-making sources so if anyone has any 'pull' with such an organisation we would be most grateful for a word or two on our behalf.

With a heavy heart I announce the resignation from our Board of Trustees of Arantxa Albert who has now returned to live in Madrid. We will all miss her enormously but hope, as she does, that she may return to the UK in the not too distant future when she will certainly join the Board once more. We wish her and her family many blessings and offer grateful thanks for all their support of *Miracles*.

Finally, I would like to offer sincere thanks to The Financial Times Conference organisers who are giving *Miracles* such an excellent presence at their international events, to Michael Kors who has chosen *Miracles* as the benefitting charity for his promotions in London and Paris and to all our Friends and supporting organisations without whom we could not operate.

Your friendship means everything to us - long may it continue.

On 13th October 2011 one hundred and thirty-five guests attended a fundraising dinner in Switzerland in aid of the *Miracles* Centre for Prosthesis and Care. The event was organized by Ingrid Tissot who runs La Fondation *Miracles* in Geneva.

The event was sponsored by Swissinterim whose directors, Jean-Jacques and Antonia Donzé, invited fifty of their friends and clients, largely contributing to the success of the evening.

A slideshow of pictures taken of amputees by photographer Richard Juillart during his stay at the *Miracles* Centre in Mostar, moved the guests to contribute generously to both the auction and tombola as well as making pledge-card donations. This brought the net profit for the evening to nearly one hundred thousand Swiss Francs.

Matthew Procter, Miracles' Head of Mission in Bosnia who had made the trip from Mostar to attend the event, received a standing ovation at the end of the evening.

"I am delighted!" says Ingrid, "For us, these funds mean limbs."

"I have been a close friend of Marie-Antoinette for a long time and a keen Miracles' supporter since its inception. In September 2008, I offered to set up La Fondation Miracles in Geneva and run it with Marie-Antoinette's help and Pierre-Laurent Bel's expertise."

La Fondation *Miracles* is dedicated solely to finding funds to help the *Miracles* Centre in Mostar to cover its running and administrative costs completely and to provide limbs for all who need them.

THE *MIRACLES* CENTRE FOR PROSTHESIS AND CARE MOSTAR, BOSNIA-HERZEGOVINA



The photograph on the left is of Eldar Voloder aged 8. He was born with no leg but despite extreme poverty and deprivation he is a happy, healthy little boy who is just grateful to *Miracles* for his new leg. The picture was one of many superb images captured by Swiss photographer, Richard Juillart, for a presentation at the Geneva fundraiser in October organised by La Fondation *Miracles* Suisse.

Project 'Bridge Keepers' was the name of the joint project between *Miracles* and the International Trust Fund which marked the third collaboration we have had with them since the launch of the *Miracles* Centre in 2009. With their funding support we were able to make and fit a further 33 limbs for Bosnian landmine victims at the Centre over the three month project period.



There are now four full time paid staff at The *Miracles* Centre under the control of our local NGO, Divita-*Miracles*: working alongside *Miracles*' Head of Mission in Bosnia, Matthew Procter, is Elvira Dugalic who manages the Centrtre; Nihad Subasic who makes and fit the limbs, and Amel Mrkonjic

who assists in the workshop as well as driving patients to and from treatment sessions and helping them learn to walk. Amel is also in charge of porterage, security and maintenance.

Apart from the 56 new limbs made at the Centre during the year, 70 corrections on existing limbs have been made and 4 limbs have been made with the use of second hand parts. Five more limbs have been made for amputees who have purchased their own materials and components, and 32 insoles have been provided for the lame.



Our very special thanks go to our two valued supporter charities, The Jericho Foundation (USA) and Saint Joseph & The Helpers in Ireland for their ongoing funding for children's limbs—including the two young football players pictured below. The centre group was taken on the Jericho Foundation's visit to the *Miracles* Centre in June with a group from the USA. It shows Joanna Shields, the Foundation's founder, next to Matthew Procter and Andrej Plavisic from our Roma Community in Zenica.

With sadness we pay tribute to Arthur McCluskey (left), founder of Saint Joseph & The Helpers Charity, who died quite unexpectedly in August. May he rest in eternal peace.



Amongst others supporting the *Miracles* Centre this past year is The Minitry of Education who has funded mine risk education for children from two schools local to the Centre. This fund covers transport, refreshments, leaflet production and stationary. Two groups of children have visited the Centre to date and two computers have also been purchased for adult education. Local business people are also supporting us as are local associations such as the Association of Amputees and the War Veterans Association who are unhappy with the treatment they currently receive and are negotiating to have their limbs made at the *Miracles* Centre.

THE MIRACLES CENTRE A brief look at some of the cases treated during the year

Sabira Dizdarevic

Sabira was born in 2000 with a condition known as 'egzartikulacija' - ie. on one side she has no leg and very little hip. The local health authority does not recognise her handicap, regarding her situation as not 'life threatening' and therefore she has no recourse to government funding for help. Happily *Miracles* was able to help her, first by taking her to the US for prosthetic treatment and over the past two years by providing her with a new limb along with the associated treatment needed. Although, as a growing child she will need an update on her limb every six months, the treatment has made a huge difference to Sabira's life: she is now able to walk, run, play sport, go to school—and leave her wheelchair behind.

Jasmin Mahmutovic

Jasmin's story was picked up by *Miracles* from a local newspaper. His father died from a land mine incident during the war. After the war his older brother drowned on his last day at school. Some time later, while Jasmin's mother was cleaning the house, Jasmin was outside playing and was run over by a tractor. He was only 7 at the time and was so badly hurt that his leg had to be amputated. He now needs a new limb every six months but at last he can play his beloved football again.

Azra Rahmanovic

Azra is 19 and lives in Donji Vakuf with her unemployed parents, older sister and younger brother. Her ambition is to become a hairdresser. Towards the end of high school she became ill and was referred to Sarajevo where the doctors diagnosed Osteosarcoma needing urgent chemotherapy. After suffering hell over three bouts of treatment, losing her hair and feeling sick all the time, the consultant doctor suggested that amputation may be the last resort. On 25th August she lost her leg and everything in life changed. She had three more chemotherapy sessions after the amputation and on 2nd November was told she was fit again. Azra was given her new leg at the *Miracles* Centre and is now learning to walk for the second time in her life.

Semir Fazlibegovic

29-year-old Semir from Mostar will never forget that day in 1992 when he was playing football with his friends between the shells and bombing of that devastated city. It was all quiet that morning when all of a sudden a shell landed just a few meters away. He felt a sharp pain in his legs and the next thing he remembered was a cold, dark room with one candle in the corner and the sound of his mother crying. Then he realised he had lost a leg. During the war he was taken twice to France to get the limb made and then, after the war, to Spain and Slovenia. The limbs were adequate but as he was a fast growing ten-year-old the limb needed up-dating every six months with the nearest prosthetic workshop in Sarajevo. With the opening of the *Miracles* Centre Semir says his problems are over. He has now got a perfect limb and knows he can always go back with any worries or problems and will find a friendly welcome and a professional team to help him. He can now ride a bike, roller blade, and take part in the sports he loves just as his peers do.

Dragan Milkovic

Referred to *Miracles* by the Zenica Sitting Volley Ball Club, 14-year-old Dragan's left leg was amputated in 2008 due to bone cancer. He lives near Zenica with his parents, sister and grandparents and their only source of income is the grandfather's meagre pension.











The *Miracles*' Roma Housing and Education Project A Report from Project Manager, Aida Saric

The year has passed quickly and happily for all of us here in the *Miracles*' Roma Community. The children attend school regularly. Five attend pre-school; eight go to elementary school; two are in high school, two more have just completed high school and two of the older ones are at technical college. All the children are provided with free books and everything they need for school and they regularly join me in our community centre for homework and study.

This year we have welcomed into our Community three new babies—two boys and a girl: Emir (Fafulic) is now nine months old; Benjamin (Memisevic) is eight months and Suzana (Suvalic) is five months.

Everyone respects our internal rules and adapts well to the environment. Many are keen gardeners whose work has been rewarded by good yields from their individual gardens; some are engaged in animal husbandry with sheep, goats, chickens and turkeys.

The houses and gardens are always neat and in good order and the children's behavior has greatly improved since the project began.

Andrej Plavisic and I work closely together—he taking care of the general maintenance and I concentrating on the families. All in all we are very happy and very proud of what we are achieving—thanks to *Miracles*.



CLWorldBrands is a global drinks distributor based in the UK. They were keen to support the *Miracles'* Roma project and in particular Lejla, who was born with Hydrocephalus and needs constant support. Lejla was housebound and her parents couldn't afford the specialised wheelchair she needed that would give her the freedom to explore her world and join her family and friends within the project. Using designs produced by our Roma children, CLWorldBrands raised enough money to buy the wheelchair for Lejla by sending *Miracles'* electronic Christmas Cards and donating to us the savings they made.

Following CLWorldBrands' generous example we are working on the same idea for this year with designs being produced by disabled children within the UK. If you would like to know more about the *Miracles*' electronic Christmas Cards we would love to hear from you.

MIRACLES' Project 'One-in-Three'

With its thriving Bosnian operation fulfilling the pledge made at the charity's conception in Mostar at the height of the cruel war in the former Yugoslavia...

*The *Miracles* Prosthetic Centre providing limbs for victims of landmines, war and disease; *its Roma Community in Zenica offering the poorest of the poor a future worth living, *and its humanitarian aid programme in a country which still lacks so much...

Miracles has now turned its attention to the alarming plight of children in the UK—our own children here at home in which the child poverty level is now 1 in 3: one of the worst in the developed world.

Since 1994 *Miracles* has been answering calls for rapid relief funding for families living in poverty and unable to cope with the added burden of sickness, disability and the problems and expense they bring.

- In April 2007 The Sunday Times Magazine printed an article on the plight of a young girl called Lauren Malins who had spent ten years of her childhood as virtual sole carer for her wheelchair-bound mother.
 - *Miracles* was already supporting Lauren and as a result of the article we were able to meet many other needs for them—such as home adaptations and specialist equipment plus putting a little fun into their lives and giving them the odd respite break.

Other requests for *Miracles*' help with Young Carers rapidly followed and a partnership was formed with The Princess Royal Trust for Carers through whom yet more cases came to light.

There are estimated to be 700,000 Young Carers in the UK—1 in 3 being the amount below the poverty line. With this in mind *Miracles* is now launching a new project called **'One-In-Three'** targeted at the children who give up their childhood to care for their sick guardians.

In so doing they often face social exclusion as well as missing out on school trips, hobby groups and all the other fun activities most children take for granted. These, therefore, are the areas on which *Miracles* will focus.

During the first three years of Project '**One–In-Three**' our aim is to reach and support an additional 550 young people living in some of the UK's most deprived areas—of which Littlehampton, where the charity is based, is high on the list.

An appeal to fund Project '**One-In-Three**' is being made to The National Lottery and other funding sources but *Miracles*' needs YOUR help, too, to ensure the project's success.

Clearly we cannot eradicate child poverty on our own but, believing in miracles and with your help, we can—most certainly—make a difference.



Christian Lunn is now 19 and a talented actor-singer having spent his childhood caring for his sick mum and dad. They found Miracles through The Sunday Times article after which we gave them their first (and last) family holiday and have since been 'there' for them in many ways including helping Christian develop his promising theatrical career.



Francesca Benson cares for her sick mum while her soldier brother is in Afghanistan. On some of her mum's frequent spells in hospital Miracles funds a riding holiday for pony mad Francesca. For Francesca it is a brief but wonderful break from her duties while someone else looks after mum.



Jade Zerk spent her childhood looking after her sick father and younger brothers. With so many hospital visits to manage plus the chance of a place at University, with help from a generous supporter Miracles was able to buy Jade a second-hand car which has been a godsend to her and to the whole family. Jade has just achieved a 2:1 degree in Religion, Philosophy and Ethics thanks, she says, to the car and Miracles. Well done, Jade!


