50 Children **50** Artists has brought together fifty eminent artists to paint 50 children in the Tower Hamlets area of London whom *Miracles* have taken under its wing. The Project aims to raise £300,000 in sponsorship from major Corporations, restaurants, schools and the general public.

Working in close partnership with social workers and Citizens Advice Bureaux in Tower Hamlets as well as other like minded organisations, *Miracles* is helping to alleviate the poverty of some truly appalling cases. During the first two months of the Project alone we had dealt with over thirty such cases including several involving child carers, domestic violence and abuse, children with terminal illness and disability and one family of four whose Case Worker referring them to *Miracles* said that their home was one of the most deprived she had seen in seven years of casework.

The London to Brighton Challenge, however, should come with a hazard warning as there are times when you fear for your well being and begin to self doubt. Then you realise that the reason you are taking part is to do your bit to raise money and awareness for a really worthy cause.

These days its quite easy for people to close their eyes to what's happening out there: the genuine suffering of those who are ill-treated and those who are in need of immediate help and get caught up with those who abuse the system.

Every person deserves a moment of happiness; every child deserves a normal start to life. I just hope that my little contribution helps put a smile on the face of those who suffer. This is what motivated me to sign up for yet another Challenge this year.

My 2014 Challenge is the 100K Thames Path Challenge which is on flatter ground and takes place in September which means the training can be done over the Summer—avoiding those dark Winter nights. And I am happy to say that I have been able (eventually) to sell the idea to my close friend and training partner, Kuldip—a great result.



MIRACLES MISSION IN BOSNIA-HERZEGOVINA

The *Miracles*' Centre on the outskirts of Mostar is continuing the truly humanitarian work to which the charity pledged itself when it was established in 1994: alleviating suffering and bringing the hope of a future worth living to so many in need.

In 2013 a total of 44 new limbs were made and fitted along with 64 corrections, 24 orthopaedic insoles and 15 orthotic devices. Help has been offered to amputees from all over Bosnia and of all ethnic groups men, women and children from pensioners to prisoners.



Miracles' work in this area is both successful and badly needed since it is the only prosthetic service provider in the region and the only provider of free limbs in the whole of Bosnia-Herzegovina where land mines are still a very real threat to life and limb.

Land mine victims numbered 6,327 from 1992 to 1996, and from 1996 to 2013 there have been 1,716 of which 600 victims have lost their lives.

In January 2014 there have already been three land mine incidents from which three victims have sadly died and three survived.

Below are a few of the cases treated at The Miracles' Centre during the past year:



SENAD DJOGAZ: Senad was born in 1981, in Srebrenica. He was injured by a land mine in 1993 and lost his leg. He is married with one child and is unemployed. Senad is very satisfied with *Miracles'* service and says now that he has a limb he feels alive again—able to help in the house, look after the child when his wife is at work, drive a car and be independent again.

RIZVAN TUNOVIC: Rizvan was born in 1952, in Mostar. He was injured in 1994 by a land mine and lost both his legs. He is married with two sons. Since getting his legs Rizvan is now back working for Bosnian Telecom, mainly dealing with cable installation which means that most of his time is spent up ladders! He is incredibly grateful to *Miracles* for enabling him to be mobile and working again.

HAMDIJA MUSTAFIC: Hamdija was born 1986, in Mostar. He had an industrial accident on a building site in 2007 when he fell some 13 meters. He was bed bound for six years in Sarajevo Hospital and in great pain whilst orthopaedic surgeons performed 42 operations in attempts to save his leg. In 2013 his leg was amputated. Just two months after *Miracles* gave him his first limb and taught him to walk again he is mobile, driving, gardening and back working again. He is happily married with a young daughter.

ALEN TIKVESA: Alen was born in 1969, in Konjic. He was injured by a land mine in 1995 but his leg was only recently amputated. Alen is married with one son. He is unemployed but since his limb was fitted at The *Miracles* Centre he is able to walk, drive, lead a normal life and has now started looking for a job. Alen is overwhelmed with gratitude at being a happy and healthy man again.

DJANI DROCE: Djani was born in Mostar in 1982. When he was 14 he was injured by a land mine and lost his leg. In 2001 *Miracles* arranged for him to have a prosthetic limb fitted in the US pending the establishment of The *Miracles* Centre. Djani now has a new limb and works as a delivery driver. He is deeply grateful to *Miracles* and tells everyone that without our help he would never have been able to walk.

La Fondation *MIRACLES* Suisse is dedicated to supporting The Miracles Centre. Its next fundraising event takes place at The Hotel Richemond in Geneva in November 2014.

The Roma Housing and Education Project in Zenica

In last year's Annual Review we introduced Project Green Shoots as an initiative to bring employment and self-funding to our Roma Community in Zenica. The idea was welcomed but sadly the money was not readily forthcoming at the time.

However, last Spring Trustee, Charles Hornung, took his family to visit the *Miracles* Mission in Bosnia—both the *Miracles* Centre in Mostar and the Roma Housing and Education Project in Zenica.

They were all deeply impressed by the work being done out there, especially Charles's son, George, who implemented the now annual Croquet Tournament at Ampleforth School in Yorkshire. At his suggestion the money raised by the Tournament will now be earmarked to fund Project Green Shoots and with this year's Tournament raising over £2,000, the initial down payment was made for the first of the greenhouses to be erected.

the children.

2013 has been a quiet and successful year. All our children attended school regularly - 9 attend Elementary School, 3 attend High School and 4 have completed the First Grade of High School. All the adults respect our rules and regulations and their integration into society is most satisfactory. Their neighbours from the village are now friendly which is a great achievement considering the problems experienced in the early days.

The social and economic situation in our County is very difficult. Roma parents and older children are trying hard to survive and find jobs. Three of our families are really successful and dedicated to gardening, producing enough fruit and vegetables for the winter months and sharing advice and ideas with their neighbours. Generally the children are good at school and we keep in contact with their teachers and supervise their school work. Often they come to us for help with home work and on many different subjects to help them learn.

We are both very happy to be part of this project which is continuing in a good direction.

Miracles' heartfelt thanks go to The John Armitage Charitable Trust, St. Joseph and The Helpers Charity and The Jericho Foundation for their wonderfully generous and continuing support for our work in Bosnia.




Remember Summer, the little girl featured in our 2011 Annual Review? Well happily she is doing very well after her long months of leukaemia treatment, but the same is not the case for her playmate and neighbour, little Ashbie. He has severe liver disease and is not very well at all.

Summer's Nan – who has been a great helper for *Miracles* over the year, asked if we could afford a break for the two of them and their families at Canute Cottages which we were delighted to agree to.

Summer's 'thank you' note was adorable: *"Thank you Miracles. I loved our holiday. I had lots of fun. Love from Summer xxx"*. The photo, too, was lovely: four young friends feasting in the cottage's lovely big kitchen.

All our families love Canute Cottages so we are very grateful to be able to use them whenever we can.



Christian Lunn, has for many years of his childhood been Child Carer for his mum, Berenice, who suffers from chronic leukaemia, and his dad, John, who had long term and serious health and mental problems.

We first met them in 2008 through The Sunday Times feature on Child Carers and were happily able to send them to Tenerife on holiday. It was, in fact, the last holiday they were to have together .

Christian has always been very keen on music and drama and *Miracles* has backed him all the way, sponsoring him in several major competitions in which he has excelled. He is now doing hugely well at University studying his favourite subject and will soon be launched into what is hoped to be a brilliant career. This lovely photo (left) was taken of him at the end of last term.

Since then John's health deteriorated and much to Berenice's sadness, he had to be taken into specialist care. Just before Christmas, he passed away and our sympathy goes out to mother and son in their sadness.

Berenice wrote this in her tribute to her husband: "On 5th December 2013 God had two special places to fill: one for John Lunn and one for Nelson Mandela. They are now at rest and in peace."

Life has been tough, too, for another of our Child Carers, Francesca Benson,

but happily *Miracles* has been able to put a few bright sparks into her life this past year, firstly with a school ski trip in March. This—and her ski gear—was funded by Trustee, Dominic Lynch and his lovely fiancé, Katherine Granger. The couple were married at Goodwood House at the end of August. (*See right as they exchanged rings*.)

We also funded another 'away break' for Francesca with her beloved horses but when she got back her mum

delivered the news they had all been dreading: her soldier brother in Afghanistan had been hit by a roadside bomb. He is now is an army hospital in the Midlands, very sick with both his injuries and with post traumatic stress.

Life has certainly dealt some hard blows on Francesca and her family—but *Miracles* is always 'there' for them.



You may remember this lovely photograph of Kier and his playmate Nikita from Northampton...

Kier first came into our lives while we were helping his older brother, Liam, with respite breaks between his leukaemia treatment sessions. Kier was born with Chediak Higashi Syndrome, a light and touch sensitive disorder affecting his sight and causing increasing health problems. His mum, Sharon, became a *Miracles*' Case Worker, helping other parents faced with life-threatening disorders and helping to raise money to meet their special needs. Liam gradually recovered from his Leukaemia but doctors had warned Kier's parents that his problem may well return when he was around ten years old at which time a bone marrow transplant would be essential. Just after Kier's eleventh birthday that is exactly what happened. He was rushed into Great Ormond Street Hospital, a search was mounted for a suitable donor and eventually, after months of hospitalisation and painful chemotherapy, a match was found and the procedure took place. *(Photo Right.)*

2013 has been a nightmare year for Kier and his family but, brave little soldier that he is, he has pulled through. The doctors said it was a miracle and Kier and his family know it was *exactly* that.

Kier's football team, Chelsea, certainly came up trumps when we approached them for something to cheer him up. They immediately sent him a signed photo and personal note from Frank Lampard and have invited him to a Training Day when he is better. And that's not the only thing Kier is proud of ...

Her case was referred to Miracles by Great Ormond Street Hospital where she was undergoing chemotherapy for Leukaemia. (See in*set—without her veil*). She would have been allowed to go home between treatment sessions until her Social Worker

discovered the appalling condition of her home. It was infested with a form of mould which would have been fatal for

the little girl. With the help of her local Council, the family was rapidly re-housed but as with so many re -housed cases in the area, they had very little furniture and the floors were bare and dangerous.

To her mother's great delight and relief, *Miracles* arranged for a new block flooring to be laid and Raihanna finally went home—another little miracle achieved. In the background of Theo's painting is the Citibank Tower—one of the first of our sponsoring companies.
