With his wife, Marie-Antoinette, Chair of Miracles, Marc was joint Vice President of La Fondation MIRACLES Suisse and prime benefactor of The Miracles' Centre for Prosthesis and Care in Bosnia. Marc has been a 'father figure' to Miracles since its formation in 1994. His memory will be treasured forever and he will be sadly missed.



MIRACLES at Twenty-One—for sick children in poverty

Miracles 'coming of age' was welcomed with a brand new project to provide Respite Breaks for our increasing number of families who desperately need the chance to leave their problems behind them and unwind for a few days in a holiday atmosphere with a breath of fresh sea air.

This 21st Birthday Present, made possible by three of our very generous Spanish benefactors, is our own Static Caravan at the Bunn Leisure Holiday Complex in Selsey, West Sussex. Officially ours on 7th August, many families have already enjoyed a *Miracles*' break in this glorious spot—right on the beach and adjacent to the many holiday attractions so popular with adults and children alike. The Caravan has its own parking space and is immediately adjacent to a lovely sandy beach and nature reserve. It is also very close to the Oasis Centre with its swimming pools, shops, restaurants and bars with top flight entertainment, and just minutes from the popular West Sands Fun Fair—the cherry on the children's' cake. Fifty Children Fifty Artists

Fifty Children Fifty Artists was launched in 2013 in Tower Hamlets in response to the high number of children living in poverty there.

The project has proved a huge success gaining significant media coverage and developing new partnerships with companies such as Citi Bank, the London Stock Exchange, St. James's Wealth Management, Winton Capital, as well as Adgenda, Ivan Massow and the Eaton Square School-all sharing *Miracles*' objective to support children and their families living in poverty and to help them through crisis situations.

Another welcome partner is the Harkable agency who created and managed the dedicated website for the project.

The paintings - by some of the UK's finest artists such as Emma Sergeant, Robbie Wraith, John Wragg, Daphne Guinness, Gerald Scarf, and James Lloyd—have been exhibited in some stunning locations: from the Headquarters of Citi Bank in Canary Wharf to Shoreditch Town Hall and the Brady Arts Centre. Its final location is the Ideas Store on Whitechapel Road. (See Poster left)

Most significantly we have seen child poverty in Tower Hamlets drop from over 52% when we launched to 48% this year—still unacceptably high but going in the right direction. Miracles can't end child poverty on our own but, with your help, we can be part of the solution.

WHO'S DOING WHAT FOR MIRACLES

THE MIRACULOUS EATON SQUARE SCHOOL

Since adopting *Miracles* as their school charity for 2015 and 2016, parents, teachers and pupils alike from the Eaton Square School in London have taken *Miracles* to heart in their efforts to raise funds for our work in this country and with particular focus on our commitment to Tower Hamlets where the child poverty rate runs at one of the highest in the country.

The school's Annual Fundraiser was held at The Savoy Hotel in March with *Miracles* very much in mind and presence. With so many of our supporters having children at the school, we all felt very much a part of the school family and extremely proud of what had been done to make the event the huge success that it was. The splendid sum of £85,000 was raised for *Miracles* on the evening thanks to a most emotive address by the Headmaster, Sebastian Hepher, and many innovative money-raising ideas including an auction of plates made by the pupils as well as a live and silent auction with some magnificent prizes including holidays at Caroline Bond's Angmering Beach House and at the Pereire's Hunting Lodge in South Africa.



Throughout the school year each different class arranged their own fund-raising projects from cake bakes to book stalls and a great many fun days.

Miracles' Prison Music Project

Following *Miracles*' long-term commitment to helping Jane Andrews through her fourteen year prison sentence and the many and varied cases for support which came out of that association, we are delighted that our prison work is continuing through an exciting project being developed by *Miracles*' Project Director, James Burton.

For six months during this past year, James, himself a singer-songwriter, has been running music workshops in co-ordination with the Drug Rehabilitation Unit in Brixton Prison, teaching prisoners to play the guitar and other instruments and to write their own music and songs. Music can be of immense value in helping prisoners to unravel their complex emotions and combat tendencies to self-harm. For those coming off heavy drug use it gives them something to work towards on a daily basis creating feelings of achievement and working towards the whole rehabilitation process to help ensure that when they are released they stay clean.



35 men went through the initial programme, 15 learning to play the guitar to intermediate level. The initial six-month programme culminated in a concert where participants performed in front of the entire prison wing.



MIRACLES MISSION IN BOSNIA-HERZEGOVINA

The *Miracles*' Prosthetics Team in Mostar continue to work miracles. This past year the number of procedures they have carried out totals 126 including 30 new limbs made and fitted, making a total of 244 since the Centre began.

La Fondation *Miracles* Suisse continues to work hard to raise the funds needed for the *Miracles*' Centre and all those involved with the Fondation are very impressed with what is being undertaken there.







Following the sad death of Marc Pereire, Patrick Fauchier, Francois Pereire and Nicolas Tissot have been appointed as Trustees to the Fondation while Ingrid Tissot has been employed on a full time basis to run it from a newly rented office space in Geneva.

In September Marie-Antoinette visited the *Miracles*' Centre in Mostar accompanied by Ingrid Tissot and their friend, Sophie Fauchier, who took many excellent photographs of the Centre's work and its patients. These have now been incorporated into the Fondation's website: **wwwlafondationmiracles.org** created by Francoise Pereire.

The scope of the limbs being treated has widened beyond just land mine victims and the Centre is running at almost full capacity. Amel, one of the boys 'adopted' by *Miracles* during the war, is progressing well with his prosthetic training and will soon be able to work on his own.

Nino Pendic, the double amputee who met and danced with Marc on a previous visit to the Centre, is now visiting regularly to give counselling to new patients awaiting treatment - a service which is greatly appreciated. Marie-Antoinette met him again on her September visit and will hopefully do so again when she revisits with Sophie Fauchier next February.

In the Spring we also welcomed physiotherapy students from Mostar university to gain practical work experience over a two week period and on the National (BiH) Day of Disability Awareness and Inclusion in December, children from the Potoci Elementary School will be with us for the day.

MIRACLES MISSION IN BOSNIA-HERZEGOVINA

Miracles Roma Community in Zenica

Our Roma families in Zenica go from strength to strength, preparing for the time when they will be independent of *Miracles* and, hopefully, self sustainable.

The community now consists of thirty-six people, ten adult/parents, thirteen young/school age children and thirteen of our original 'children', now eighteen and over—one of which is at University. All the rest have completed their schooling and two already have jobs in the town nearby. They are all hardworking and caring individuals, proud of their homes and gardens with some of them working wonders at Home Improvement. The children are well disciplined and doing well in their school work. The older children are studying hard to fit themselves for employment when their studies are complete.



Project Green Shoots continues to thrive and the produce grown was a welcome bonus to their food supplies. They have just planted a crop of spinach which will grow over the winter months and we look forward to getting more pictures in the spring.

Another *Miracles*' family that is growing fast is that of our Trainee Prosthetist at the *Miracles* Prosthesis Centre in Mostar, Amel Mrkonjic.

Los Rosales Kindergarten, Mostar

With the generous sponsorship of Julia and James Ogilvy, *Miracles* was once again able to support Los Rosales in Mostar, the only Kindergarten in the Herzegovina-Neretva county for children with special needs. There are currently 14 children at the school aged between three and seven, many of whom are unable to speak. The Kindergarten faces ongoing financial problems with very little help from the State and constantly struggles to provide food for the children, sanitary needs and transport.



Miracles is deeply grateful to Julia and James whose support was initiated in memory of two very special cousins, Hayden and Cameron Lord, who died very young from Tay Sachs disease.

The Ogilvy's son, Alexander, visited the school recently on his visit to the *Miracles*' Centre in Mostar. He is pictured (*left*) with the Kindergarten Director, Mirna Mezil, and on the wall beside him is the picture of his two little cousins. Alexander is 19 and on a Gap Year before heading for University in America.

Last year our Annual Review was accompanied by an appeal for sponsorship for **LOUIS WILLIAMS** to run the London Marathon. He completed it in the fantastic time of 3 hours, 58 minutes and 47 seconds and raised over £2,000 to fund respite breaks for *Miracles*' families.

Louis puts a huge amount of effort and time into training and fundraising for *Miracles*, the charity he has known since he was two and one of the first young Leukaemia patients to benefit from a respite break at the Holiday Home which *Miracles* ran for Children with Leukaemia (Now: Children with Cancer.)
